#### URGE DENIAL

(Continued from page one) to ask approval of Durham's share of the recently issued \$90,000,000 school bond issue. Durham was slated to receive \$43,117.30.

Cameron said his division was taking Weaver's request under consideration. He stated that the telegram to Dr. Erwin was not acted on at the meeting in view of the educator's absence from the city. According to Cameron, action on the telegram is unlikely until the board's next meeting on November 3.

The complete text of the Thompson-Wheeler telegram follows:

Honorable Clyde A. Erwin  
State Superintendent Public Instruction  
Education Building  
Raleigh, N. C.

Newspapers indicate Durham City Board of Education will appear before your panel today asking approval of construction projects some of which are for white schools. We respectfully call your attention to provisions of the N. C. General Statute Section 115-25 which provides that the State Superintendent of Public Instruction is empowered and it shall be his duty to direct the schools, enforce and execute the school law, and to direct the operation of the public schools and enforce the laws and regulations in relation thereto.

Section 115-2 also provides that the children of the white race and the children of the colored race shall be taught in separate schools and there shall be no discrimination in favor of or to the prejudice of either race.

Loray Board had school properties reappraised in 1947, and on basis of average daily attendance for 1948-1949 and using 1947 valuations the value of buildings in Durham City System was \$774,041 for each white child and \$30,237 for each colored child.

This represents Harrahan discriminatory practice by the local Board in violation of Section 115-2 of North Carolina General Statutes. We therefore request that you deny approval of further construction in white schools pending correction of discriminatory conditions. Under provisions of Section 115-8 you are required to approve plans for each new school building proposed by City Board of Education.

We urge you to exercise the power granted you by North Carolina Statutes to prevent discrimination and wish also to call attention to the fact that these statutes not only give you the power to prevent discrimination but state that you are charged with the duty of preventing it.

Above quoted figures showing per capita outlay are further supported by figures shown in your latest published report to the effect that the per capita outlay for each white child in Durham City Schools is \$497 against \$194 for each colored child. Your careful consideration to this matter is respectfully requested.

#### HEADS DRIVE

New York (AP) — Mrs. Eleanor Roosevelt has accepted honorary chairmanship of a national campaign to raise \$50,000 for Bethune-Cookman college, it was announced last week by Mrs. Mary McLeod Bethune, founder and president-emeritus of the institution. Earl Bunting, prominent industrialist, will head the corporate gifts division of the campaign.

The National headquarters for the campaign, which is being carried forward by "Friends of Bethune-Cookman college", have been established in the Duane hotel in New York City.
