PHILADELPHIA (AP)—

U.S. Sen. Graham, one of the leaders in the battle against the Korean War, has been hospitalized since March 1, and the Senate has been told he will remain there until March 6. The Senate Committee on Foreign Affairs said the physician who recommended after a week's absence Dr. Frank P. Gandy, former medical inspector for Service Medicine in New York, examined Graham and reported him in good shape physically but said he suffered from nervous exhaustion. Graham lost a hair-tugging 10-pound decision several days ago to Guy Gruhan in New York.

LEAGUELISTS GAMES FOR 1950

CHICAGO (AP) — The official schedule of the Negro American League was announced last week by Dr. J. B. Martin, league president. The first half of the 1950 season will begin May 7 with Indianapolis at New York; Cleveland at Kansas City; Houston at Chicago; Philadelphia at Baltimore and Birmingham at Memphis.

It will close July 24 with Chicago at Baltimore; Kansas City at Birmingham; New York vs. Houston; Cleveland vs. Memphis and Philadelphia vs. Indianapolis.

The schedule follows:

MAY 14 — Baltimore at New York; Cleveland at Houston; Indianapolis at Birmingham; Philadelphia at Kansas City; Memphis at Chicago.

MAY 21 — Cleveland at Indianapolis; Kansas City at Philadelphia; New York at Baltimore; Chicago at Memphis and Birmingham at Houston.

MAY 28-30 — Birmingham at Memphis; Chicago at Cleveland; Houston at Baltimore; Kansas City at Indianapolis (Open); Philadelphia at New York (Open).

JUNE 4 — Memphis at Kansas City; Philadelphia at Birmingham; New York at Chicago; Houston at Cleveland; Indianapolis at Baltimore.

JUNE 11 — Indianapolis at Kansas City; Houston at Memphis; Baltimore at Chicago; Philadelphia at Cleveland; Birmingham at New York.
