GIRL, 14, DIES IN MYSTERY FALL OFF SCHOOL BUS

girl, student at the local Arm- vances October 27-31. strong High School, who was fatally injured near here late Mon day afternoon when she jumped or fell from a moving school bus Victim of the unprecedented tragedy is Bernice Smith, who died shortly after having been admitted to a Dunn hospital following her leap or fall from the school vehicle carrying her home.

Two eye-witnesses to the incident, James Williams, 19, and Clifford Godwin, 19, reported that the girl suddenly got up from her seat near the middle of the machine, rushed to the front door and fell headlong into the road.

Site of the tragedy was some 200 yards from the spot where the victim was accustomed to boardingand leaving the bus. Speed of the vehicle was estimated at 35 miles per hour at time of the

The young girl, who along with williams, the driver, and Godwin. the bus captain, composed the entire occupancy of the bus, gave no indication of her intention, but hurried to the front of the machine, turned the handle operating the door and then disappeared

The bus was brought to a halt and the girl rushed to a hospital where she died shortly after ad-
