KILLER MUST SERVE STINT IN MISSISSIPPI

JACKSON, Miss. (AP)—Whitcomb White, who served here last week against a life sentence imposed against him for his part in the massacre of three Negro children in Attala County in January, 1950.

White had been convicted after Leon Turner also white, pleaded guilty and received a life sentence. The three participated in the murder of the children of Thomas Harris at the latter's tenant farm home.

The trial member of the trio, Malcolm White, had pleaded guilty to manslaughter and received a sentence of 10 years.
