DYING INDUSTRY Ice Harvest Was Big Business Before Electric Refrigeration.

THIS WINTER'S sustained freeze in New England and the Middle Atlantic States brought out skates, skis, and sleds—and reminded old timers of the not so long ago when the harvesting of natural ice was big business.

Food cooling ventured out of caves and springhouses only a little more than a century ago. Thomas Moore, a farmer of Montgomery County, Maryland, obtained the first U. S. patent on a household icebox in 1803. Moore's idea could make little headway, however, at first.
