After the business session, a delicious ice cream course was served during an enjoyable social hour.

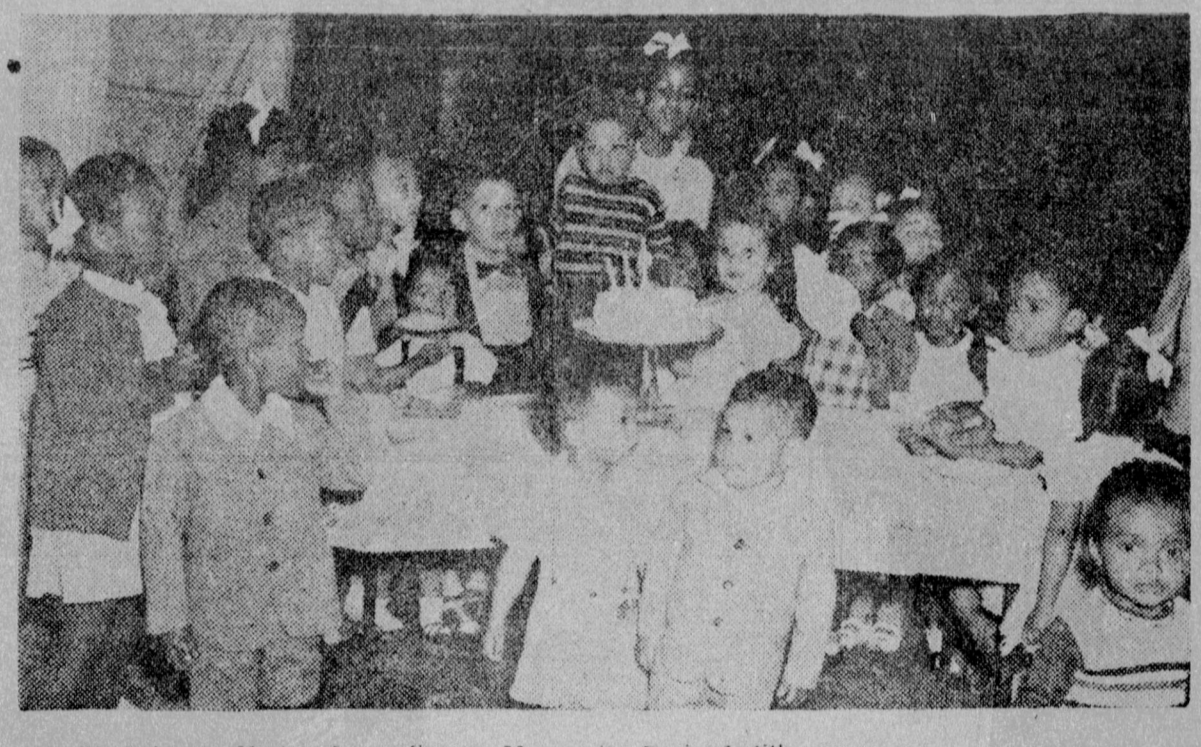
