Carolina's Cities Practice Jimcrow Brotherhood

MOCKVILLE ONLY TOWN TO NOTE TRUE MEANING

Ministers Exchange Pulpits For Sunday Interracial Event

RALEIGH—While the rest of the nation was observing national Brotherhood Week last week in a notably unbiased manner, the majority of North Carolina's big cities placed jimcrow tactics in the observance.

The sole exception to state-wide biased observance was in the small town of Mockville where a Negro minister spoke before a white congregation while a white minister delivered a message before a Negro group.

While Mockville was carrying out the intended meaning of Brotherhood and Interracial Sunday, 1122 was being practiced in the large cities as white ministers.

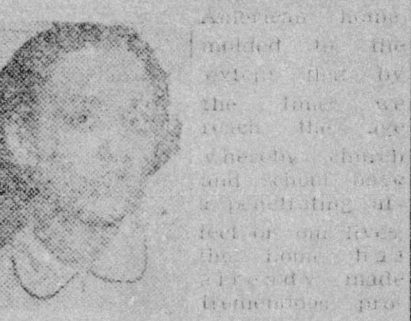

Livingstone Gets \$76,000 Grant

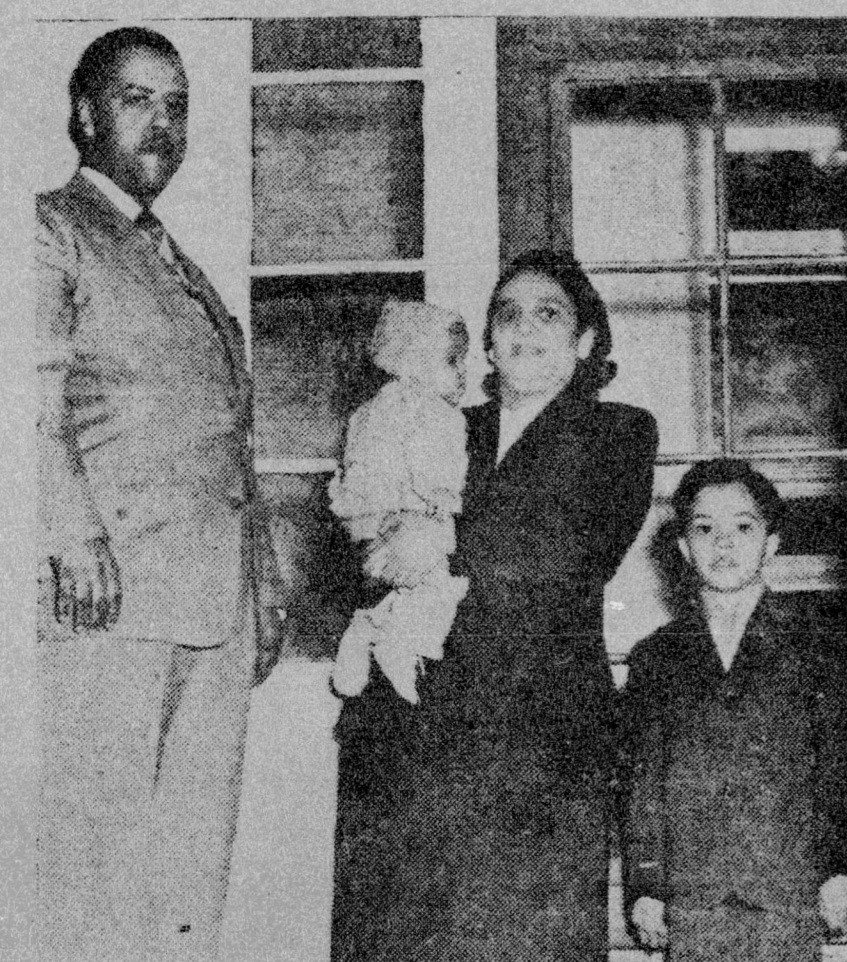
SALISBURY, N. C. — A gift of \$76,158.58 was turned over to Livingstone College here last Tuesday when the bishops of the A. M. E. Zion Church, general officers, ministers and laymen met here for the final report of monies collected for the college for Founder's Day, which is celebrated in honor of the founder, Joseph Charles Price, yearly.

The church is divided into episcopal districts and each district brings its report to Salisbury. The 2nd episcopal district, presided over by Bishop W. J. Walls turned in the largest sum. The 3rd district, led by Bishop J. W. Martin had the highest percentage. The report from this district revealed that its quota had been overpaid to a total of 110 per cent.
