MISS BURMA THORPE, student, Raleigh.

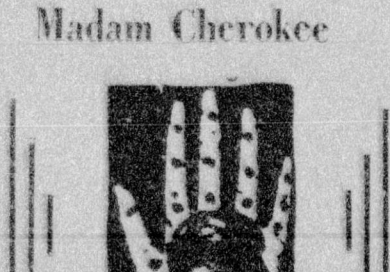
