This vegetable is not re ated to spinach and I have noiced that the students in my ve getable gardening classes wh ave taken some home for trial parents were making. sually come back for more I find that most of the boys in these lases have never eaten Swiss chard, New Zealand spinach, kohlabi, eggplant, sprouting broccoli auliflower and Chinese cabbage or Brussell sprouts. This mean possibly that these crops were not grown in the gardens back home. would say that this is an indicaion that our planting plans need ome revision before next year. Chinese cabbage, green sprouting brocoli, kohlrabi, and Brussel sprouts are best grown as fall rops. Brussel sprouts seed should be sown by July 1 and the plants transplanted as soon as they are

large enough. Chinese cabbage, kohlrabi, and broccoli seed, may be sown in late July or early August and thinned out or trans

Melt shortening; blend in sugar, well-beaten eggs and vanilla. Sift together flour, baking powder and salt: blend into first mixture. Stir chocolate bits and walnuts into batter. Spread in greased 9-inch square pan. Bake in a moderate (350° F.) oven 30 minutes. Cut into bars while still warm.

To keep sweaters, mittens, sacques, bootees, blankets and bonnets soft and sweet, wash often. In this way they won't get soiled heavily and will require not so much work to get clean.

Bonnets should be washed as directed for the material used. Pad a bowl with soft cloth and fingerpress bonnet after washing and place over the bowl to dry. There will be little pressing,' then!


