**Ceiling Prices On Lumber**

RALEIGH — Dollars and cents ceilings for southern yellow pine lumber are established by OPS Ceiling Price Regulation 149. District Director Alton G. Murchison said here today, noting that 75 percent of eastern Carolina lumber is this type.

The regulation covers manufacturers' sales of specified lumber products including retail-type sales. Basic ceiling prices are established for standard grades and sizes. The regulation requires that all persons who sell or buy lumber must keep certain records covering transactions for two years. Copies of invoices setting forth the required information are considered accurate records.
