## BIG CATCHES OF BIG GAME FISH

MANTEO, N. C. — Big catches of big game fish have been made on the coast of Dare County this season. Through the past week-end a total of three snappers had been landed. Since the 1952 Gulf Stream fishing season began one while mullin has been landed. Two record breaking game fish—a 97 pound cobia and a 35 1-2 pound channel bass have been taken. During mid-June a Danville Virginia angler caught a 41 pound wahoo, largest of the species ever taken along the Dare Coast and small game fishing is also good with large catches of blues, trout and other varieties being made daily.

## Build A Finer Carolina

Use of corn, oats, and barley in the first half of the 1951-52 feeding season was about 5 per cent greater than a year earlier. Heavier feeding to livestock accounted for all of the gain. Stocks of the three grains on April 1 were about one-sixth lower than in each of the last three years, when April 1 stocks were unusually high.

By the time your baby is about three months old your doctor will probably tell you to start him on solid food. Was your baby starts on solid food—whether it's cereal or strained fruit—is up to your doctor. How your baby starts is very much up to you!  
Mother's attitude can make first spoon feeding a pleasant new adventure or a battle of wits. Since baby's first reactions may influence his mealtime habits all through childhood, it's important to get off to a good start.  
"It helps avoid worry if you remember that solid food is generally offered these days before there is acute nutritional need for it," says Dr. Otto A. Faust, Consulting Pediatrician to the Beech-Nut Packing Company.  
Since milk, in early months, still supplies a baby's main food necessities, he can take his time getting used to solid foods, their new tastes and textures. The important thing, according to Dr. Faust, is for the baby to learn to like to eat.  
These quick tips can help make first spoon feedings enjoyable:  
Start slowly, a tiny taste on the tip of a spoon-sized spoon.  
"Thin the food so it's 'soupy' if baby rejects it in its more solid form. Many babies gobble up thin foods like Strained Banana or Apple Sauce "fat is."  
Let baby decide whether he wants it before or after his bottle.  
Expect him to be surprised at this (to him) funny new stuff.  
Relax and enjoy watching him slowly learn how to handle it.
