second degree murder and rape in the death of Miss Janet Ellen King, Salisbury native, in District Court last week.

District Court Judge Alexander Holtzoff accepted the plea but said he would wait until the case could be investigated by probation officials before announcing the sentence.

Tyler had previously been charged with first degree murder of the coed whose body was found crumpled in the street in Washington after having been criminally attacked, choked, and shot three times.

Later he was declared of unscund mind by psychiatrists of Gallinger hospital, but in a subsequent examination by St. Elizabeth hospital doctors ruled Tyler's mind was sound.

Tyler's guilty plea was entered by his attorney Wesley Williams without coming to trial. Assistant U. S Attorney Martin J. McNarmara, Jr. did not object to the seconddegree murder plea because of the conflict in expert testimony.

At the time of her death, Miss King was a transfer student at the local institution, having studied previously
