He told the group that "Education consists of more than an accumulation of facts. It is a process of development, and a long difficult path which we must travel." He named some of the problems which students have to confront during these times as:

1. Problems of adjustment to college life due to inadequate high school facilities, crowded conditions and in many instances poorly prepared teachers. Social and academic freedom found in colleges which do not exist at home.
2. Problems growing out of the uncertainty of our world situation. So many of our young men are either in the army or going, as they do not know what the future holds.

He cited some of the great literary writers, scientists, and musicians, who received their education through difficulty, and who have made the greatest contributions in life. In conclusion he said, "If we are going to be educated under difficulties, it will depend upon what circumstances find in us. If circumstances find in us determination, self appreciation, and the will to achieve, it can

Lyman, who makes his home in Mt. Vernon, N. Y., attended New Wilt Clinton High School in New York City and New York University before entering North Carolina College.

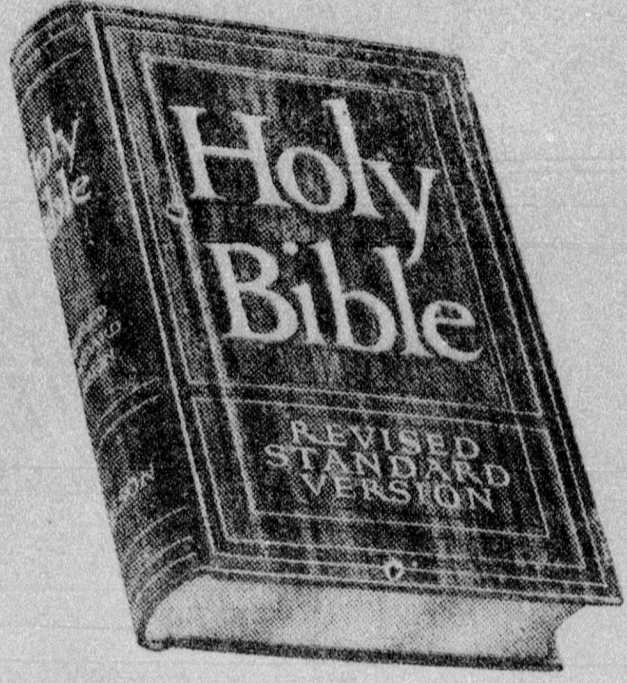

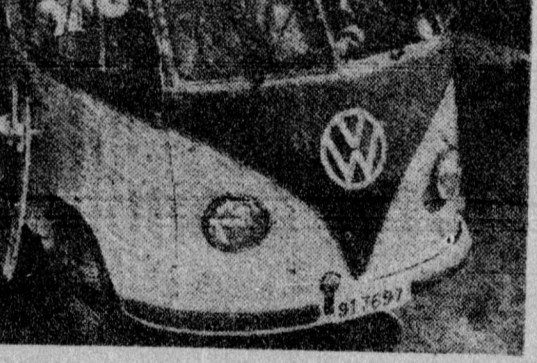
James Linton USSD has returned to his ship USS Donner, at Norfolk, Va., after a 5-day leave with his family.
