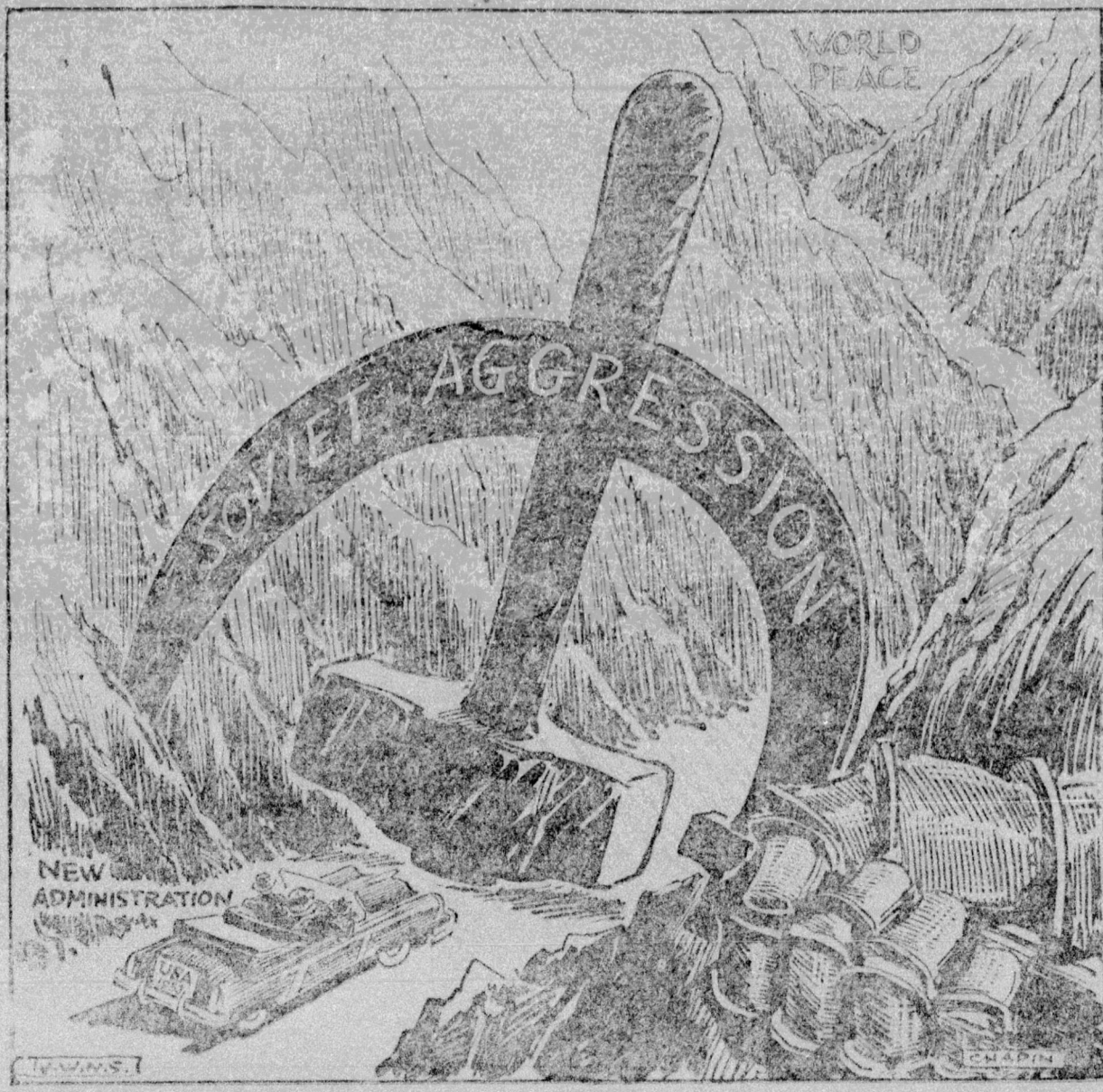

SAME OLD ROAD BLOCK



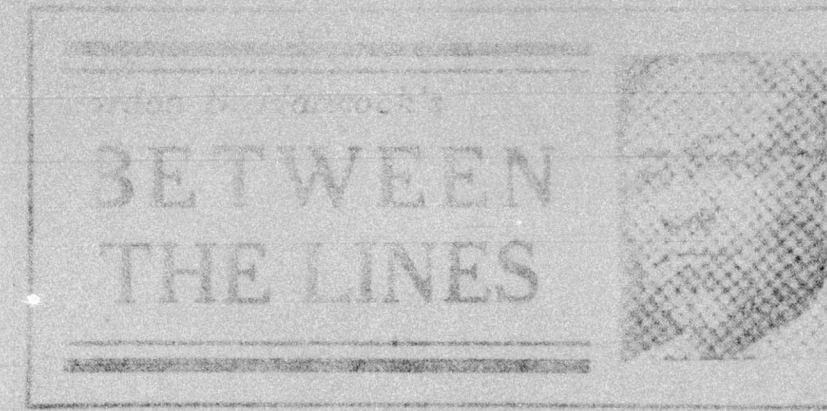
