Miss Marie McKoy of Elizabethtown was Sampson County's second highway fatality in 19 hours.

Highway Patrolman Martin N. King said Sunday's accident occurred when a car reportedly operated by William D. Herring, 32, of Rt. 1, Gerland, struck the rear of a car driven by Billy Wright of Elizabethtown.

The victim was a passenger in Wright's car.

King said Herring was arrested and charged with manslaughter.

# Monte Irvin Inks 1953 Pact With NY Giants

NEW YORK — Saying that his once-fractured right ankle was as good as ever, Monte Irvin Monday signed his 1953 contract with the New York Giants.

Club officials beamed when the 37-year-old outfielder put his signature on a contract calling for \$25,000.

Irvin's contract was the same as last year's, \$25,000 plus \$1,000 for each of the last two years.

Irvin, who has played in a total of 123 games during his career, was the only player to play in all 154 games of the 1952 season.

The Cleveland Indians program, consisting of Thanksgiving in Denver, N. C., and a game in Philadelphia, Pa., on Dec. 27, was the only game the Giants played during the season.

The family was very happy to see Monte get into a regular line-up.

Monte's only regular season in Philadelphia was in 1947 when he was the team's MVP. He played 130 games and hit .300 with 27 home runs and 100 RBIs.

He was traded to the Giants in 1950 along with Duke Snider and Ed Simmons.

Monte's career totals are 1,500 hits, 250 home runs and 1,000 RBIs.
