REV. A. EASLEY IS HEARD AT ST. AUGUSTINE'S

RALEIGH — Do not be discouraged, because people have been hit by all kinds of catastrophes and after each disaster have re-organized themselves and gone on. The Rev. Alexander H. Easley, chaplain at St. Paul's Polytechnic Institute, said in his sermon as officiating priest for the Anniversary Services commemorating the 84th anniversary of St. Augustine's College in the College Chapel Sunday morning.

He said that one-fourth of the population of England, three-fourths of the population of Europe and whole populations in some cases were eliminated by the Black Death in 1348, but the population of Europe is increasing more rapidly today than any other population.

The Rev. Easley was introduced by Dr. Harold L. Trigg, president of the College, and assisted in the services by Dean Christopher C. Gray.

St. Augustine's was organized in 1869 under the name of St. Augustine's Normal and Collegiate Institute and began operations in January 1871 in a building loaned by the Freedmen's Committee with offices in New York, but by December, 1893, had acquired land and buildings and moved to its present location.

The Rev. Easley is a 1941 graduate of St. Augustine's College and a graduate of the Bishop Payne Divinity School in the class of 1944.
