

Mechanical Pump Aids Heart Surgery



Performs Work of Heart While Surgeons Operate

The pump shown here in action is an artificial heart. Made of stainless steel, glass and rubber, it takes over the function of pumping blood to the body during heart surgery. The heart is temporarily emptied of blood which is by-passed around it. This is a great advantage to the

surgeon since it permits him to open and operate on the almost bloodless heart by direct vision. If the me-chanical heart is not used, he must depend on sense of touch alone. The development of the mechan-

ical heart marks another milestone in the forward march of surgery which has advanced rapidly since the first successful heart operation only 15 years ago. Contributions to the Heart Fund
