

Curtains and Aprons from Dishtowels



HOW YOU CAN MAKE THEM Need new kitchen curtains? Been wanting a shoe bag? Use an extra apron or a potholder? All these and many other household articles can made easily and quickly from dishtowels or face cloths. Instructions for these sewing miracles come from Lever Brothers who have initiated a national "Sew and Save" campaign, in connection with their all-purpose detergent Breeze which, with every package, gives the consumer either a Cannon dishtowel or face cloth.

Here are tested instructions: Curtains: For one pair of curtains use two towels. Stitch a casing across the top of each to allow rod to go through. Sew hall

inches from bottom for trim. Shoe Bag: Fold towel up to three inches from top. Stitch down center. Sew bias binding all around

Apron: Stitch two towels to-gether lengthwise. Turn so the stripes run horizontally and make a casing across the top for the apron string (use bias binding) to go through. Stitch rick-rack down through. Stitch bias bind the sides two inches from edge, corner to form a loop,

and across the hottom stripe.

Clothespin Bag: Fold towel up in half. Make casing across top to allow cord through. Stitch up sides to within five inches of top. fringe across bottom and two Stitch bias binding around lower sides and across the bottom.

Bib: Fold face cloth in half and out out half neckline. Stitch bies binding around all sides leaving enough to tie.

Potholder: Lay one face cloth on top of another. Fold corners to nearly meet the center and stitch through. Stitch bias binding at one




