## Rocky Mount Wholesaler Practices Fair Employment

ROCKY MOUNT—That a local wholesale grocer has seen fit to put into practice his own private Fair Employment Practices by giving employment to colored people beyond the usual "deliveryman" status is deemed noteworthy in this Eastern Carolina city where one-third of the people are colored.

Hires Colored Saleslady M. S. Tharrington, a whole-

saler who is universally known as a man who treats all his customers right, regardless of race, has become the first white merchant to hire a colored girl as a combination clerk and saleslady who drives the panel truck and takes orders from stores over the city.

Realizing that much of his business comes from race merchants, Mr. Tharrington felt

approximately 300 guests were present to witness the presentation which was received by State NAACP President Kelly Alexander, Raleigh President Charles Jones from Links' President Mildred Taylor.

Visiting as well as local Links were all charmingly dressed and were identified by a corsage of lilies and carnations tied with a large silver ribbon.

Mrs. Gertrude Harris was head of the Program Committee and Mrs. Lizzie Constant headed the Social Committee.
