FAYETTEVILLE, N. C. — Funeral services for Young Williams James Cogdell were held from Mt. Zion AME Zion Church in Eastover Sunday afternoon with the Rev. J. A. Ashley officiating. Burial was in the Church Cemetery. The deceased is survived by his parents and two sisters.

Cogdell was totally wounded by the discharge of a single shot, a calibre deranged pistol in a person Street pommel last Wednesday night, and Jasper H. Melvin is being held on an open charge of murder.

He admitted the shooting but claims the weapon had discharged accidentally. Thursday morning as given a hearing in Court, and was



THREE ROOM ADDITION SET FOR SCHOOL
