Shaw Instructor Given Fulbright Art Scholarship

RALEIGH — Samuel L. Green, instructor of Art at Shaw University since 1931, has been awarded a Fulbright foreign scholarship to study during the school year 1953-54. The grant provides for study in Art at Courtauld Institute of the University of London. In addition provisions are made for Mr. Green to visit and study art galleries in England and on the Continent. His special study at London will be in the area of museum curatory.

Mr. Green was awarded both the A. B. and A. M. degrees by Howard University, where he majored in Art. As a graduate student at Howard, he was awarded the James V. Hering Scholarship Award. Later he was given special permission to do art museum training at the Barnett-Aden Gallery in Washington, D. C. During the summer of 1952, he studied at the Skowhegan School of Painting and Sculpture, in Maine, on a fellowship awarded by the school.

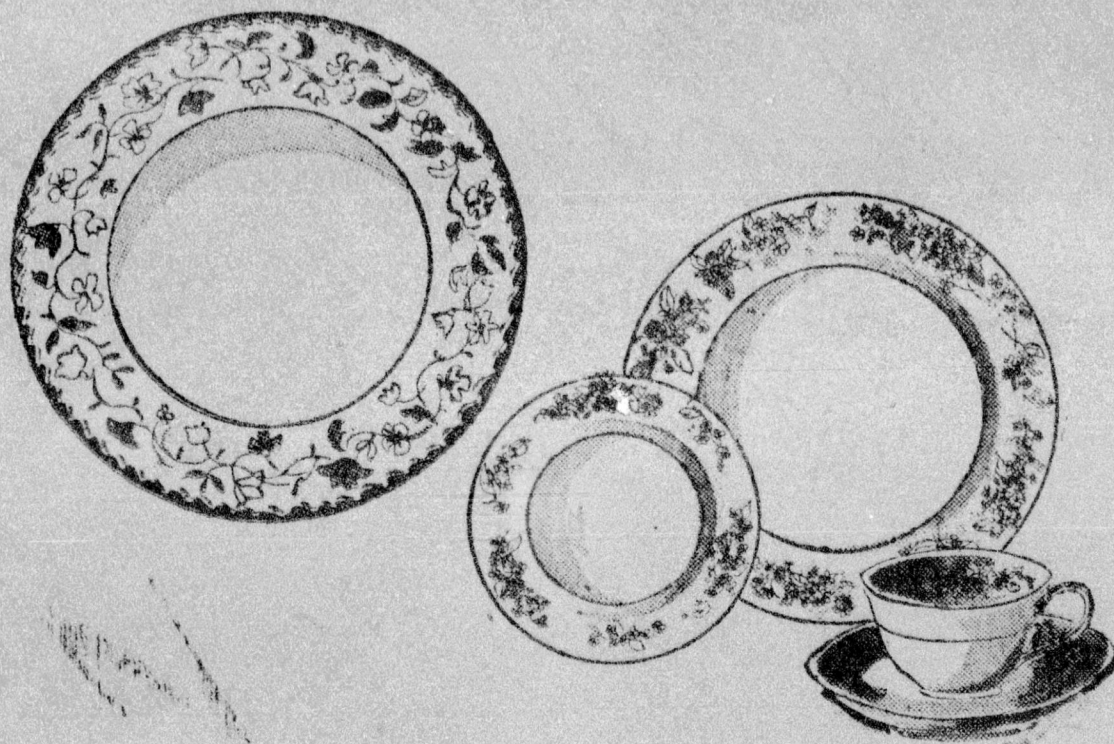
Prior to coming to Shaw University, Mr. Green was a fine arts instructor at Florida A. and M. College and helped to establish the school's present art gallery.
