

SALE OF REAL ESTATE FOR TAXES

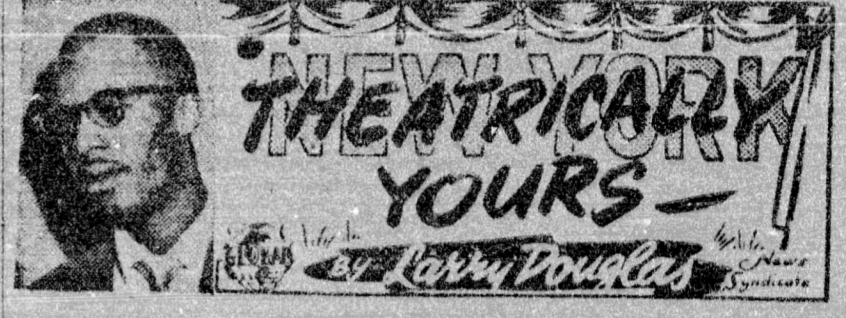

WASHINGTON AND "SMALL BUSINESS" BY C. WILSON HARDER

Many red faced Potomac pundits heard Attorney General Herbert Brownell announce major MCM S. oil companies, charged with conspiring with British to create worldwide monopoly, will face court action. Justice Department is giving the accused benefit of doubt. A special committee, with final authority vested in the President, will screen those documents. If any are found dangerous to national security, they will not be published but government will know the full facts. Hence current red faces. Now Pundits say Brownell is pushing civil action instead of original criminal action, leaving backdoor escape open if the government case is proved. Even dollar damages, they say, do not equal jail sentences. But unbiased observers reject this theory as much too premature. After all to prove white-washing intents, they say, a brush should be used in the hand of a would-be whitewasher. Attorney General Brownell says under civil procedure rules the government is in a much stronger legal position to force major oil companies to deliver up certain documents than under criminal law. The oil companies have so far not produced them. Their reasoning is curious. They claim that publication of the documents would threaten U. S. foreign relations and security. Federal authorities are on record as unable to see why publication of such documents should endanger national security. An answer will be sought to this one question: Is U. S. foreign policy in many spheres controlled by the U. S. government, or by a few major U. S. oil companies allied with British petroleum in a worldwide monopoly? Hence the interest in the forthcoming anti-trust action.
