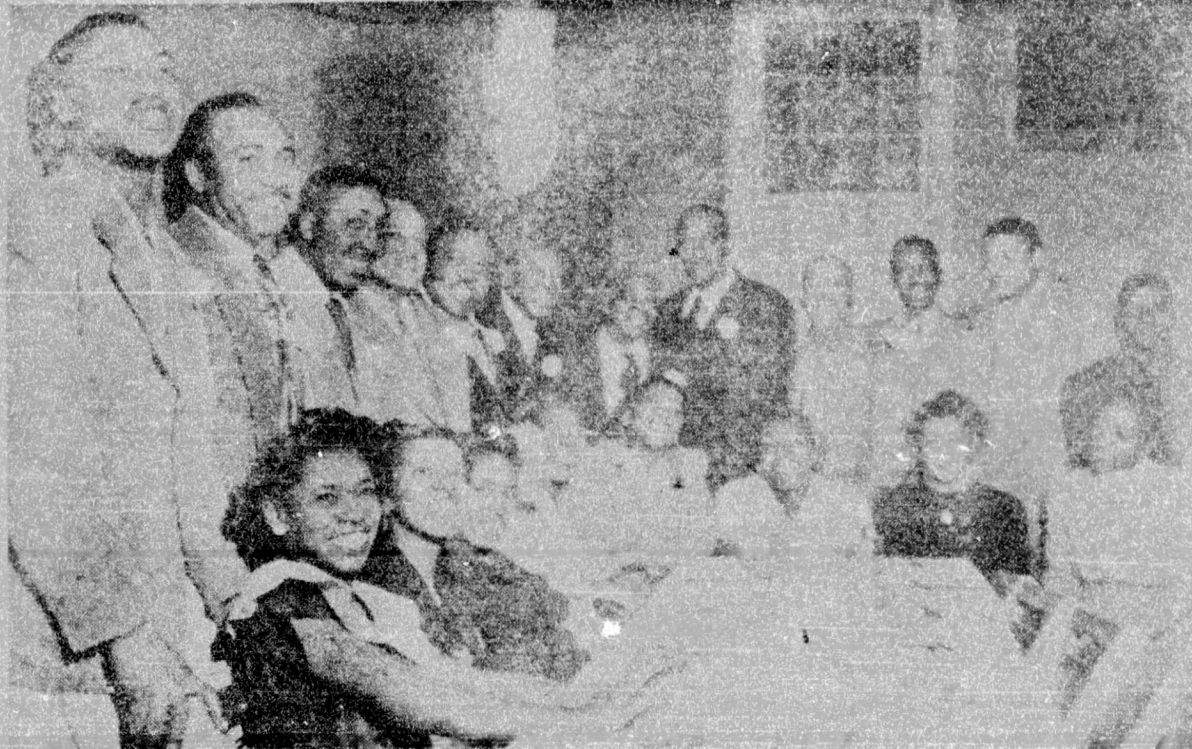

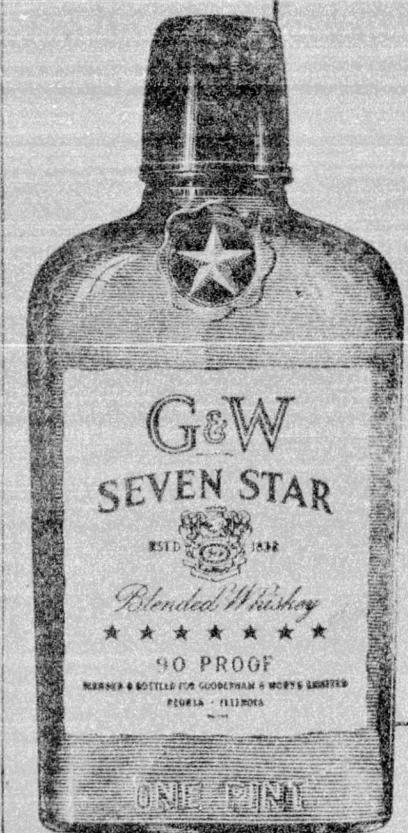
The Library Club and Advisors, Mrs. E. B. Lytle and Miss S. Fields, sponsored a party recently in the Agriculture Building.

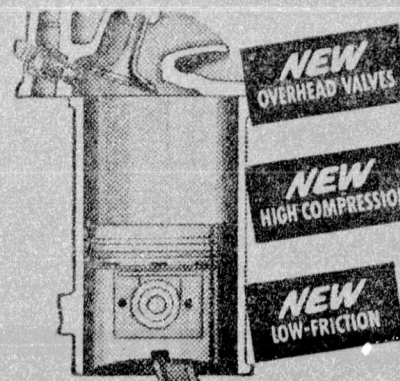
