Are you getting tired of running the cultivator and wading the hoe in your garden in a losing battle with weeds and grass? Why not use a mulch?

It is surprising how few gardeners make use of mulches as an aid in the conservation of moisture and the control of weeds. A mulch may be any material such as hay, straw, straw manure, leaves, leafmold, peat, sawdust, pine straw, or paper, which is put down on the ground around plants for the purpose of conserving moisture during the hot, dry summer weather.

At the same time a mulch will keep down most of the weeds. It has been reported that one outstanding gardener collected all the cardboard boxes he could get at the store, flattened them out, and put them on the ground around his plants as a mulch — and the results were excellent. I have

TIMELY FARM QUESTIONS— QUESTION: Will black shank be filtered out of river water if the water is passed through about 100 yards of soil?

ANSWER: Probably yes. It is difficult to conceive of any disease organisms remaining in water after it has stepped through soil for that distance. However, if you paint a resistant type tobacco the black shank present in any surface water you may use should not cause any trouble. Unless you have complete control over the water there is apt to be some black shank.

QUESTION: How should I store my aromatic tobacco after curing?

ANSWER: When adequately dried in the curing barn the tobacco can be stored on the sticks

NEW YORK, (GLOBAL)—The Mau Mau of Kenya have taken from the British is over shadowed by the results that will come from their rebellion. Those who forced themselves on the hapless natives allowed them no voice in their government. Further, they were allowed no opportunity to become educated.

Could anyone blame the most daring and courageous natives of Kenya for opposing such injustices? The Mau Mau of Kenya have lost heavily in trying to gain the rights that are naturally theirs. They have been slaugh-

Audio-Visual Affair Slated At Va. State

PETERSBURG, Va. — Virginia State College has been selected to provide an information and materials exchange service in audio-visual education by Teaching Film Custodians and the Conference of Presidents of Negro Land Grant Colleges. It was recently announced by Dr. Samuel A. Madden, Director of the Field Services Division of the Council. Dr. Madden has been chosen to direct the service.

The service, which will be known as an Audio-Visual Information and Materials Clearing House, will serve more than forty institutions of higher learning which have teacher-training programs and are members of the Leadership Conference on Audio-Visual Progress of Instruction in Teacher Education. All of the schools having membership in the conference are those that have prearranged, trained teachers for service in schools primarily attended by Negroes. Held at VSC in May of 1954, the Leadership Conference had as its chairman Dr. Robert E. Daniel, President of Norfolk State College. It was the first national audio-visual conference of its kind.

The establishment of the Clearing House is one of the steps toward the improvement of audio-visual teaching in the Negro colleges of the South.
