Here's a tested skillet meal featuring ground beef in which the beef is cooked with rice and celery in a sauce of tomatoes and bullion. Just-right seasonings give it good flavor.

- HAMBURGER SKILLET DISH**
- 1 lb. ground beef
- 1-2 cup chopped onion
- 2 1-2 cups tomatoes (No. 2 can)
- 1 2 teaspoon pepper
- 1 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce
- 3-4 cup uncooked rice
- 1-2 cup chopped celery
- 2 teaspoons salt
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 1 cup bullion or meat stock
- Brown rice slowly in 2 table-spoons hot lard in a heavy skillet, stirring frequently. Add onion, celery and ground beef; brown lightly. Add rest of ingredients. Cover and simmer until rice is tender—about 45 minutes. Season to taste. Yields 4 servings.

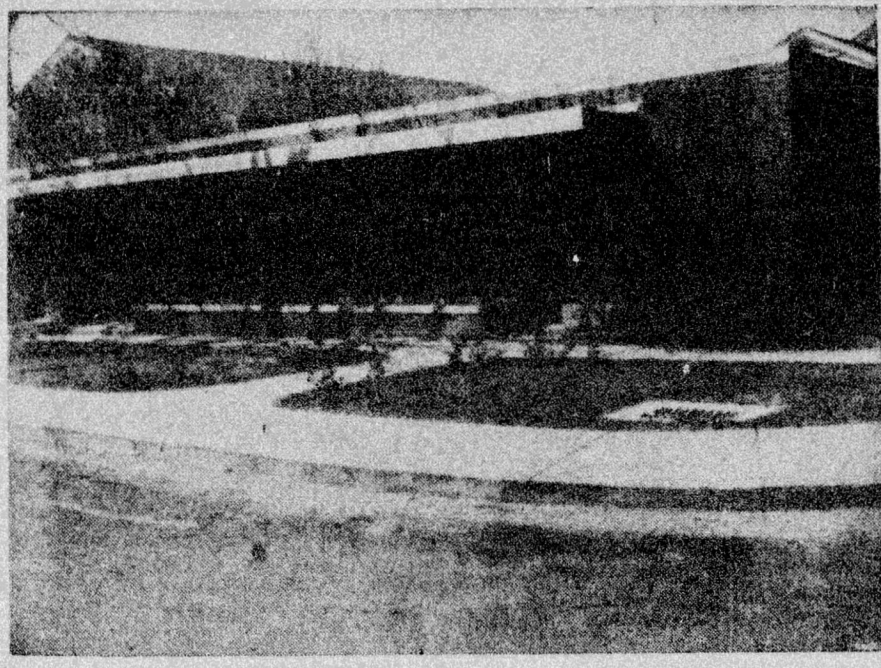
**My Neighbors**
