Woodson is the State sprint champ from Chicago's Austin High School. This, of course, brings us back to the discussion of "cycles" in sports when certain sports activities seem at times to be dominated by a particular racial group. The cycle of Negro domination in the boxing field seems on the wane; but baseball has come up with so many Negro heroes that Negroes are certainly a factor in organized ball whether they are dominating the sport or not. And now we have an all-Negro backfield coming into Illinois, which reminds us of the Irish backfield at Notre Dame years ago, known as the "Four Horsemen."

All of this is particularly interesting to us, also, because we can remember when a Negro couldn't even get a "look-in" when it came to breaking into the football team at Illinois. My own son, Fritz, Jr. had made an outstanding record as a grid star, and when his High School coach went to Illinois to coach, he wanted to take Fritz with him. But he learned on good authority that there was no chance for a Negro at Illinois, and advised my son to go elsewhere. How times have changed!

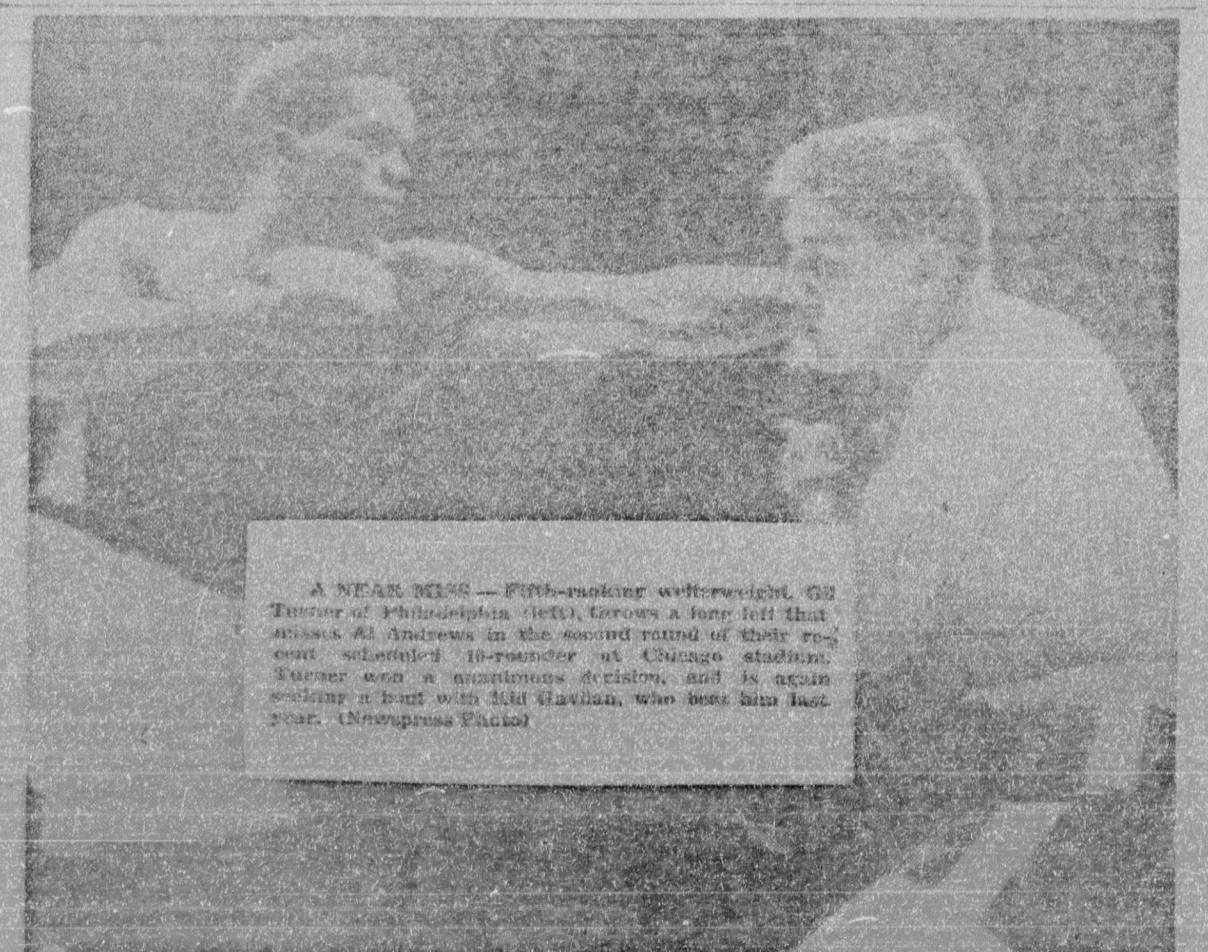
