Mass Chest X-Rays To Begin Oct. 1

A mass chest survey, to X-ray the county population 15 years of age and over for tuberculosis, is being planned by the health department. The survey will start on October 1. The survey will reach all parts of the county, and will utilize the mobile unit of 50 different locations. It will start through November 1st.

110,000 persons are estimated to be in the county. However, a total of 75,000 is being surveyed. The first county-wide survey held in 1931, when 75,000 X-rays were taken, is the first of the X-ray survey.
