DURHAM — Miss Margery Brown, teacher and director of Hillside High School, has a two-page spread of drawings in Life magazine, "Sketches of Life's Pictures," section for the week of September 21.

The featured young artist is the sister of John H. Meadows, president of the Mechanics and Farmers Bank of Durham and Raleigh.

She taught at Hillside High School during 1934-1935 when the late Professor W. D. Pennington presided.

After leaving Durham, Mrs. Brown returned to her alma mater, Spelman College, Atlanta, Ga., where she taught art and spent four years ago when she and her family moved to Newark, New Jersey.

In addition to her studies at Spelman College, Mrs. Brown had graduate work at Ohio State University where she received a master's degree in her field.

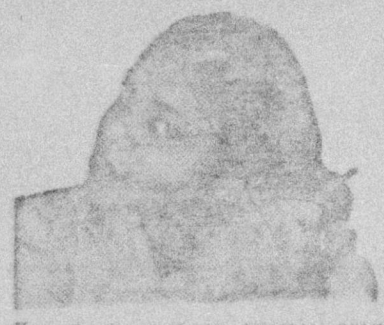
