

# Babies Cremated In Rural Fire

## Tots Sleep As Flames Raze Home

MILAN Tenn. — (AP) — Two tiny children were burned to death last week when fire destroyed a county home, five miles north of Alwood, Tenn. Marion Phillips, Jr., 26 months, and James Phillips, his 15-month-old brother, were asleep in the home

while their father was picking cotton and the mother was out of the house 15 minutes before the fire was discovered.

She was some 500 yards from the house when neighbors discovered the flames. Cause of the fire was probably a defective flue where wood was burned in a stove in the room in which the children were sleeping, according to Chief M. N. Hilliard of the Milan fire department.
