Campus Round-up

FISK DEBATES TAKE ON
OXFORD TEAM

A visiting Oxford University debating team last week clashed with debaters from Fisk University on the question of whether or not the Western powers have met the Communist challenge.

Debating the subject "The Western Powers Have Failed to Understand and Meet the Challenge of Communism" were Peter Topsell and Derek Bloom of the Oxford team, and David Lewis and Preston King of the Fisk group.

The question provoked a lively discussion although opinion of the panel was divided. It proved, however, that Fisk representatives more than hold their own against the internationally famous team from England.

Supporting the affirmative were Topsell, a British Army veteran and now a member of Oxford's Morton College, and David Lewis, a junior history student at Fisk, who entered the university as an early entrant before graduation from high school.

The negative argument was presented by Bloom of Oxford, and King of Fisk.

Topsell and Bloom are natives of Sussex and Northumberland, England, while Lewis and King hail from Atlanta and Albany, Ga.

King, a pre-medical student, is also an early entrant.

Another foreign visitor to the campus was Eybind Bartels, Danish counsel general to the United States, who spoke at a seminar on "Economic Relations Between Europe and the United States."

Both events were held in the International Student Center.

NORTH CAROLINA COLLEGE — A member of the North Carolina State Department of Public Instruction, Dr. S. E. Duncan, last week urged an orderly desegregation of the nation's schools to thwart international criticism and domestic disrepect for the law in a speech

on the NCC campus. His topic was "Some Socio-Economic and Psychological Implications of Integration."

The North Carolina Negro College Conference meeting in its 25th annual session here voted to study ways and means of creating more job opportunities for Negroes.

The action was taken after Mayes Behrman of Greensboro, director of the Merit Employment Program of the Ann Arbor Friends Service Committee, told the group that Negroes at present had only between 500 and 1,000 of the 40,000 different jobs listed in the government's employment dictionary.

In another move, the conference passed a resolution praising the recent U. S. peace award decision on segregation.

ATLANTA UNIVERSITY: A total of 40 students from Columbia University, Hamilton, N. Y., attended with graduate students in business administration at Atlanta University to discuss problems of Negro business and employment integration of the races.

Cash premiums at the combined shows totaled \$4,231. There were 229 blue ribbons, 238 red ribbons, and 148 white ribbons awarded.

Interest High In Annual

4-H Dairy Cattle Show

Interest in the 14 Negro District Dairy Cattle Shows held in North Carolina this year continued to increase although the total of 615 animals shown was below last year's figure, according to R. L. Wynn, extension dairy specialist.

Wynn said the dip in number of cattle reaching the district level this year could be accounted for by dry summer and the fact that the participants depend largely on pasture to condition their animals. He said many more were eliminated than usual because of their condition.

He emphasized that the over-all participation, the training of the animals, and the general know-how of the boys and girls


