

NAACP's Robert Carter Urges Officials To End Jim Crow In Traveling

WASHINGTON—Declaring that enforced segregation in inroads the "appropriate but equal" theory the NAACP presented earlier today to the House Select Committee on Civil Rights legislation in stages of its requiring it.

Lawyers for only two of the railroads—the Illinois Central and the Texas and Pacific and the terminal company participated in arguments. They denied that they


