Two Outstanding Palmetto Extension Workers Retire

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Two outstanding farm demonstration agents of South Carolina, William Thompson of Clarendon County and George Daniels of Orangeburg County, retired recently after serving a total of 63 years, reports E. N. Williams, State Extension supervisor.

During a surprise luncheon given them last week at South Carolina State College, Mr. Thompson was presented a gold wrist watch by farmers of his county, and Mr. Daniels was given a plaque by the Orangeburg County Farm Bureau. Mr. Daniels went to work for Extension Service as a county agent in Orangeburg County in 1916 and remained at the post until a few weeks ago. His major efforts were directed toward helping the farmers feed their soil and their livestock properly. He stressed soil building, crop rotation and increased production of corn and other feed crops for cattle and hogs.

Mr. Thompson became a county agent in Clarendon County in 1929. He found the farmers there growing only cotton and tobacco. His first objective was to get them to grow other cash crops. He chose sweet potatoes as a starter. The first year, one farmer harvested 240 bushels of high grade potatoes off a single acre. Within three years, the farmers of Clarendon County weren't entirely dependent on cotton and tobacco.

Later Mr. Thompson concentrated on hogs and beef cattle. Today the farmers of Clarendon have a balanced farming program. State Agent Williams says Mr. Thompson brought prosperity to the farmers of his county.

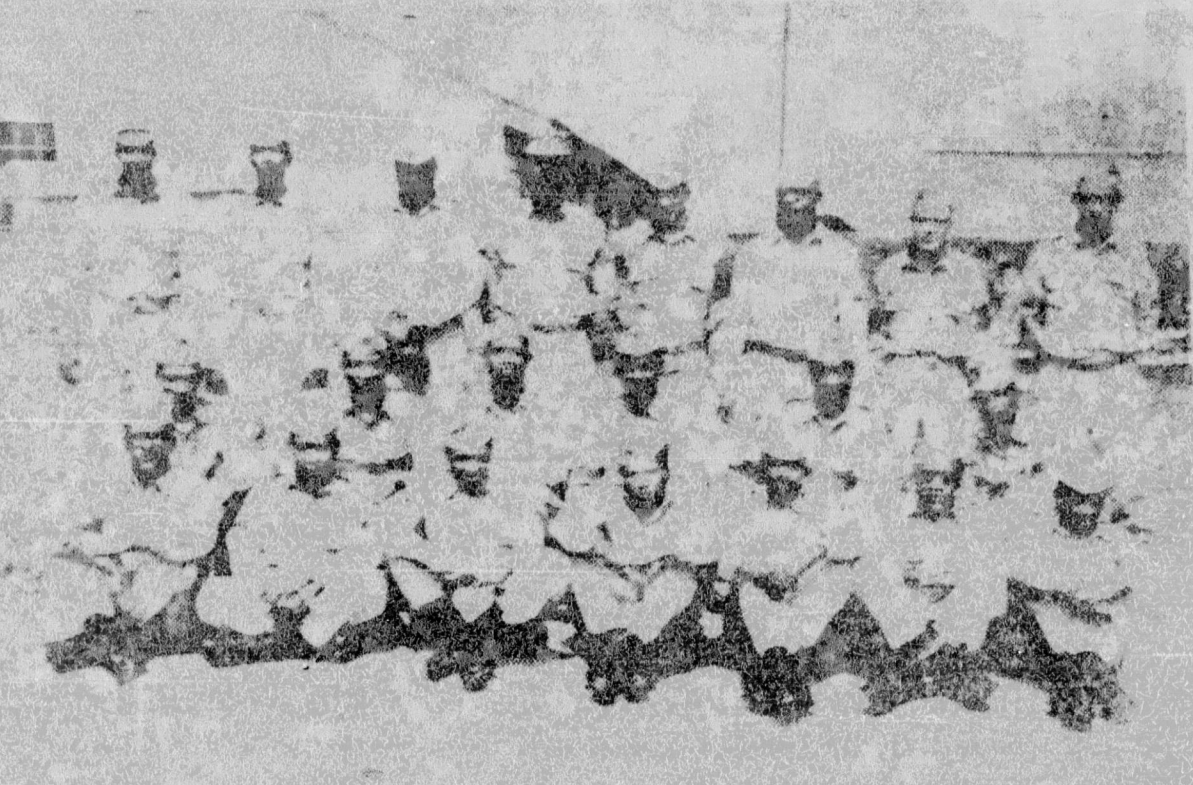

VACUUM CLEANER CARE

A dered perborate bleach carbon dioxide vacuum cleaner preserves color. The vacuum cleaner should be stored in a well-ventilated, easy-to-get-to cleaning equipment closet. If it is stored in the basement, attic, or utility room, it probably won't be used. If you have a vacuum cleaner, you should be sure to use it with cold water. The homemaker should keep the vacuum cleaner, its attachments and all cleaning supplies together in a compact storage unit.

STAIN REMOVAL FROM CAR PETS
