HELD IN MATE'S DEATH
ZEBULON — Mrs. Pearl Yarboro, Zebulon resident, has been jailed in the fatal stabbing of her husband, Jopnie Yarboro. The fatal incident is said to have occurred Saturday night, Wake County Jail. Duke said that Yarboro, about 40, bled to death from stab wounds in the leg. A main artery was severed, he said. The man is alleged to have been stabbed during a fight over "domestic troubles." Mrs. Yarboro is scheduled to receive a hearing this week in the Zebulon Recorder's Court. No charges have yet been lodged against her.
