

Integration Inevitable, Sociologists Tell Bennett

GREENSBORO — Many viewpoints on the problems of desegregation in education were expressed by two outstanding sociologists as Bennett College concluded its week-long faculty conference Wednesday.

The conference which followed the theme, "Integration: Challenges to College Teachers," concerned itself with three main areas, namely, "Implications of Integration for the Department of Instruction," "Integration and Student Adjustment," and "Exploration of Integration Through the Field Studies Program."

Speaking at the luncheon which concluded the conference, Dr. Gordon F. Lovelace of Gardner College, outlined a 10-month program for those who would work for a better world through improved human relationships.

"Prejudice," he warned, "is a one-way street. We must rid ourselves of the prejudices within ourselves if we are to have others rid themselves of ours."

Dr. Lovelace suggested that in the present controversy over desegregation, it is wise for those who are for such a change should work not only with those who have like thoughts, but also with those who disagree.

"Learn to distinguish between the motivation of men and the way that they express their desire to act. A well-intended person can sometimes become a dangerous person, particularly if he does not use the proper techniques."

"We are definitely in a transition period," he decided, "but I am willing that he would not permit to give a timetable as to how rapidly changes will take place."




