ELIZABETH CITY — Miss Lillie May Whigham, 22, of 1116 South Pitt Street, is believed to have been the passenger riding in a car with Wilber Rasberry when his tractor-trailer crashed into a tree and burned Friday morning. Rasberry and his passenger were trapped in the car and their bodies were burned beyond recognition. One physician and the Gates County Coroner, J. M. Eason, examined the charred bones at Twilford's Funeral Home and it was established that they were those of a woman and a man. The mother of a young woman said that her daughter had been missing since Thursday and friends told her that she was last seen getting into the truck cab with Rasberry at Greenville. Patrolmen reported that the driver apparently fell asleep.
