#### Begin Work On Million Dollar Science Building

GRAMBLING, La. (Special) Contractors have started work on a \$1 million science building at Grambling College.

Modern in concept and colorful in character, the structure is being described by state education leaders as possibly the most outstanding facility of its kind among Negro educational institutions in the country.


it will enable Grambling to offer a wide range of science courses impossible in the past because of limited space and facilities.

The structure was designed by Van Os and Flaxman, Shreveport architects, and will be erected by Baton Rouge Contractor George A.

Caldwell's contract calls for compietion of the structure in 400 working days.

Designers of the project said the building, whose exterior will be of brick veneer and steel construction, was drawn to harmonize with the architecture style currently existing on the campus.
