HONOLULU (AP) — For only the first time in his career, Sen. James Eastland was silent when he brought his Subcommittee on Internal Security here for a week-long investigation of communism in Hawaii.

The senator's silence was a surprise to those who had followed his behavior during his entire stay in Hawaii. He seldom spoke at the hearings, and then only in a manner to give the impression of being kindly and genial.

At no time did the Mississippi racist give even a hint of his attitudes toward colored people or on the parity of the white race, although daily he saw dozens of mixed couples as well as individuals of different racial stocks. He even attended social functions at which there were Oriental and part-Hawaiian guests.

More than 75 percent of the population here is of the Hawaiian race, and it is an interracial harmony that has made a major goal with Eastland, one of his bitterest opponents through fear that two non-white senators might be sent to Washington to aid the campaign for civil rights legislation.

Accordingly, as soon as the hearings were announced early in October, the H.W.U., by far the most powerful group in Hawaii, launched a campaign exposing the racist attitudes of the Mississippi white supremacist. A full page advertisement denouncing "Eastlandism" was prepared for the daily press which refused to accept it. This material was then printed and distributed door to door. A major portion of the nightly H.W.U. radio program was used to blast the senator.

The day before the hearings began, Harry Bridges, H.W.U. president, gave an interview to the daily press in which he described Eastland as a "bigot, a liar and a Ku Kluxer who thinks the world was made only for the white man." He told reporters to "come around tomorrow and I'll think of some more names to call him." He also dared the committee to call him as a witness.

Eulogize 6 Nurses In N. Y.

BROOKLYN (AP) — A funeral mass for Maxine Singleton, 19, was held last Friday morning at Holy Rosary Catholic Church. She was one of six popular seniors in nursing at St. Mary's Hospital who were killed Dec. 9 in a highway accident.

Funeral mass was held for all six at the hospital. The girls, who would have graduated next spring after three years training died when their car skidded on the icy highway near Danbury, Conn., into the path of a huge trailer milk truck. They were returning to Harlem Valley State Hospital at Wingate from a weekend visit to see their families.

Miss Singleton was born in a town near Sumter, S. C. She attended Holy Rosary parochial school and St. Joseph's Commercial High School, where she was a member of the school's band. She was also a good pianist.
