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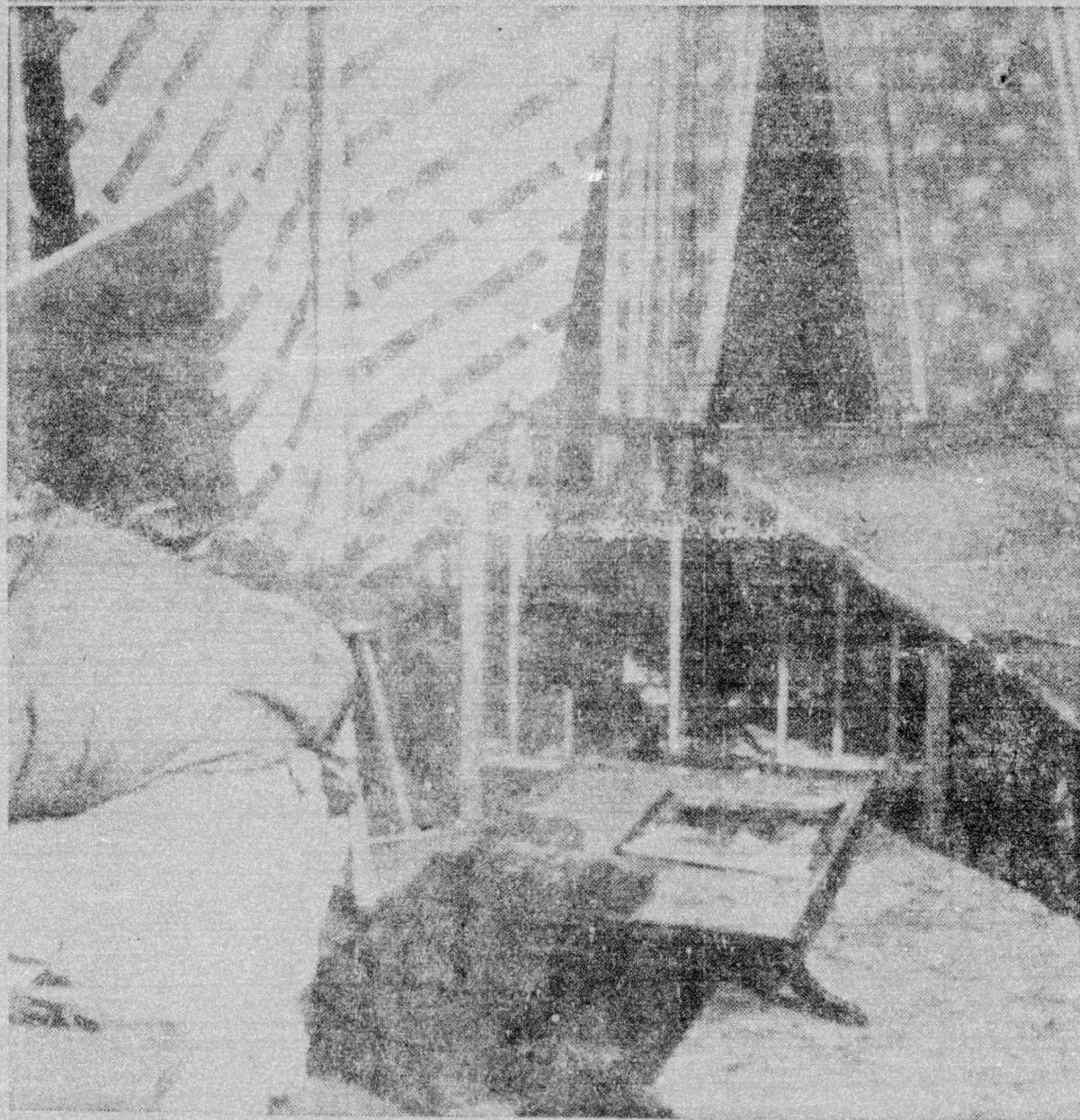

### Warns Segregation May Revive The KKK

**CHICAGO** — Everett R. Clinchy, head of the National Conference of Christians and Jews, has warned of the possible "re-emergence" of the Ku Klux Klan in the South due to fears over desegregation.  
However, Clinchy said he believed a revival of the Klan would be a "Temporary fanaticism, providing we do a job in diagnosing the fears and allaying them."  
Clinchy also told a news conference Monday that the anti-segregation White Citizens' Councils should be credited for apparently trying to avoid violence and to work through legal means.  
The Councils may prove a "Stabilizing force" in human relations in the South, he said.

It wasn't enough for Eddie Lee to film Mrs. Evelyn Wilson out of ten dollars. He insisted on coming back for some more easy money. It was this coming back that proved his downfall.  
Mrs. Wilson, proprietor of the Tip Top Inn on E. Dovic St. here, said a person called her on the telephone Saturday morning, Feb. 9. The caller identified himself as Mr. Haywood, a local funeral director. He told Mrs. Wilson that she was on his list to solicit friends from the Reverend Martin Luther King in Montgomery, Ala.  
"Mr. Haywood" told Mrs. Wilson that she was down for \$100 and a Mr. Lee would pick it up.  
That evening about ten o'clock, Lee called upon Mrs. Wilson and collected the \$100 she had promised to "contribute." When she asked Lee for a receipt for the money she was told that Mr. Haywood would send her a receipt later.  
After Lee had gone, Mrs. Wilson called Mr. Haywood at the Raleigh Funeral Home. Mr. Haywood was not in but the assistant manager, Mr. Greene, told Mrs. Wilson that he felt reasonably sure that Mr. Haywood did not know anything about the matter.  
A little later on Mr. C. A. Haywood, Jr. called Mrs. Wilson and voiced the same opinion.

### Wilkins And Ervin Clash

**WASHINGTON** — A Negro leader accused southern congressmen Tuesday of resorting to "specious talk . . . and obscene comedy" in efforts to block civil rights legislation.  
Roy Wilkins, executive secretary of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, made the charge in testimony before the Senate constitutional rights subcommittee.  
The subcommittee is holding hearings on President Eisenhower's four-point civil rights program and other "rights" legislation.

### Clinton Blast Rocks 30 Homes

**CLINTON, Tenn.** — Police this week said a blast that had costed some 100 persons in the Thursday night dynamiting of a Negro section of race-troubled Clinton but "none of them has been taken into custody."  
Chief Deputy Robert Amrett said: "There are no new developments in the case, but we are working day and night to try to bring in the persons responsible for the blast."  
Wide-spread damage resulted after a white man planted a suitcase full of dynamite in the heart of the Negro section. Three persons were slightly injured and 30 homes scarred.  
It was by far the most destructive of eight explosions set off since Clinton High School was finally integrated by Federal court order last August.

### NAACP Foes Fizzle In Showdown Try

**RICHMOND, Va.** — An expected showdown between the NAACP and two state legislative committees trying to curb the activities of the Negro group in Virginia fizzled on Tuesday when a hearing here in Federal court was postponed until Feb. 27.  
NAACP Aides Oliver W. Hill had asked Federal District Judge Sterling Hutcheson for a temporary restraining order against a subpoena from a Richmond City Court ordering the NAACP to open its membership rolls for public inspection.  
The subpoena, obtained by two "Watchdog" committees of the Virginia General Assembly, would have been effective this Wednesday. But Hill's lawyer's delay of the hearing also ties up the subpoena for at least one extra week.  
Both sides indicated today they consider the postponement a "Moral Victory." Hill pointed out
