Theological Alumni Observance At Shaw University April 23-24

One of America's outstanding ministers will be principal speaker during the seventeenth Theological Alumni Observance at Shaw University, April 23-24. This year's event will feature a sermon and lecture by Dr. James H. Robinson, minister of the Church of the Master, Presbyterian, New York, N. Y. It is expected to attract the largest group ever to attend.

The Reverend Mr. Robinson whose theme will be "The Preacher Under Judgement," has been acclaimed as "one of the great church statesmen of our generation" by Reinhold Niebuhr.

In addition to serving as pastor, he is the founder and executive director of Morningside Community Center in Harlem. He was nominated in 1956 as moderator of the Presbyterian Church, U. S. A.

He was the first member of his race to have the honor of giving the Lyman Beecher Lectures at Yale. His 1955 series were published by Channel Press, Inc. in 1956. He is also author of Tomorrow Is Today, Love of This Land and an autobiography with the title Road Without Turning.

The two day celebration will be with a fellowship dinner for ministerial graduates of Shaw, April 23rd. The Reverend James A. Forbes, president of the Bible Institute, Goldsboro, will address the dinner meeting.
