The grand lodge, whose leadership is predominantly Republican, commended Pres. Dwight David Eisenhower "for his stand and insistance upon a strong Civil Rights Bill." Also commended were Atty. General Herbert Brownell, Sen. Douglas of Ill., and Senator Dirkson, of Ill., along with other liberals, for their stand in pushing through Congress the first Civil Rights Bill in 80 years.
