IMMEDIATE COMPLIANCE ASKED IN VA. — Two Negro attorneys demanded a "prompt and reasonable start" toward integrating schools of Virginia's Prince Edward County this week and promised new legal fights if the state tries to close its schools to avoid desegregation. The attorneys asked the U. S. 4th Circuit Court of Appeals to reverse a federal district judge's refusal to set a deadline for desegregation in the county's public schools. Prince Edward is the only Virginia locality directly involved in the U. S. Supreme Court's historic 1954 desegregation order. The circuit court took the case under advisement after hearing the argument. Oliver W. Hill and Spotswood W. Robinson III, attorneys for the National Ass'n for the Advancement of Colored People, contended that Judge Sterling Hutcheson of Richmond did not follow procedure the U. S. Su-

## On Bonus Money: Our Churches And What They Shouldn't Cost Us

Year in and year out we go to church in the same unassuming mental frame, paying usually the same amount in the collection plate, supporting rallies, etc., without possibly realizing that there are things we could do to aid ourselves spiritually and financially and support our churches more adequately. No doubt most churches would welcome better spiritual and Christian attitudes, along with the finances to support the physical part of their programs. Much of the above could be accomplished through the following: 1. Instead of smoking a pack of cigarettes a day, all of us who smoke could easily make out with 15 cigarettes a day. In a week's time more than the cost of a pack of cigarettes would be saved amounting to 35 cigarettes or in money about 40c. 2. Instead of eating steak at one meal in the week, which would amount to about 20c per person, we could get practically the same food value, certainly as full a stomach, from a meat substitute like a well-seasoned codfish cake, which would only cost about 5c, creating a difference of 15c.

## Supreme Court Set To Rule On Five Cases Involving Negroes

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States Supreme Court is facing this term with three cases involving school segregation, two dealing with organizational discrimination and two others directly involving Negroes. One of the cases deals with education on the public school level, one on the graduate level and the other with an agitator who attempted to obstruct school integration. The organizations calling upon the high tribunal for legal decisions are the NAACP and the Railroad Brotherhood. The other two Negroes involved directly in pending cases are Claud Meck Lightfoot who is testing the validity of the Membership Clause in the Smith Act; and Agy Len-

MONROE — The National Association for the Advancement of Colored People Tuesday investigated a possible connection between an abortion charge against a Negro doctor and his activity in the Negro organization. Dr. A. E. Perry, vice-president of the local NAACP chapter, was arrested Sunday night on a charge of performing a criminal abortion on a white woman, Mrs. Lillie Mae Rape. He was freed under \$7,000 bond pending a preliminary hearing Friday. Perry denied the charge and said he felt the Ku Klux Klan might have provided the information which led to the charge.
