#### **Church Bonus Money Rules**

**Auto And Train Collide** 

All purchase slips or receipts presented to your church must come from stores advertising in the CAROLINIAN.

Each week carries a date in the Bonus Money period. Purchases eligible must come from the store during the week the "ad" appears.

No purchase slips representing a business should be submitted. All receipts thust come from individual purchases.

All churches in Raleigh and Wake County are eligible.

Bonus period.

However, this does not mean that second and third awards cannot be sought consecutively. Consequently away church group has the opportunity to secure an award every period.

No purchase of over \$300 from any one merchant during a week can be pounted.

There is a ceiling of \$38 per person a week for grocery purchases.

In the event of the same amount of purchases by more than one entry, the ward will be divided.
