

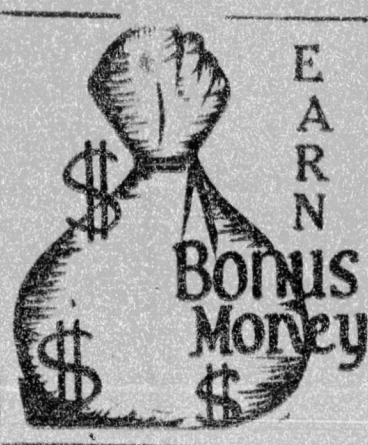

YORKTOWN, Va. — Authorities said Monday they believe a Negro widow has abandoned her plans to move into an all-white rural community near here after some 20 white men fired shots and hurled stones at the house she had rented.

Special Officer Richard Goode said the woman, Mrs. Molly Spriggins, (CQ), and her five children had not returned to the house since the Friday night incident.
