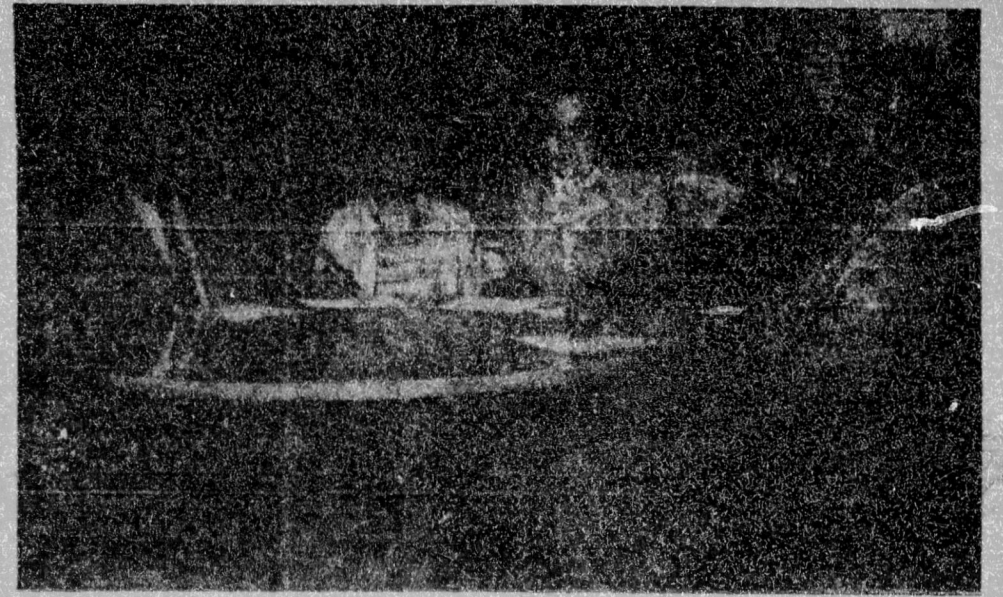
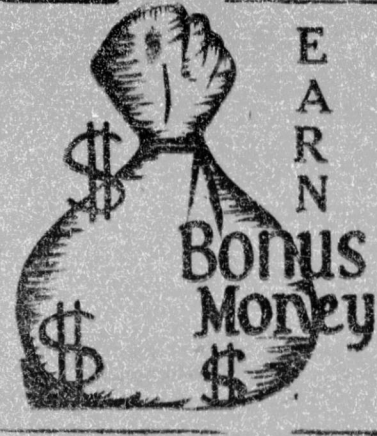

Controversial Johnston Library Opens Doors To All; Negroes Using Facility

By CHARLES R. JONES SMITHFIELD — This town's "white" public library swung open its doors to members of all races last week, following several months of "negotiations" with Negro leaders in the community.

The Rev. J. H. Bryant, president of the Smithfield Civic League, which led the fight for admittance to the facility, told THE CAROLINIAN this week that he has used the library twice since it lowered its racial bars.

One stipulation in the proclamation was that the library would accept only Negro adults. However, Rev. Bryant took his son, Patrick H. Bryant, 11, to the library with him on one occasion and the youth was accepted along with the other occupants of the facility.
