"Insufficient Evidence" In Tex. Bus Case

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States Department of Justice has just announced that they were not able to get sufficient facts in the case of the alleged beating of an African ministerial student in Texas, almost eight months ago, to support prosecutive action.

This information was relayed to Congressman Charles C. Diggs, Jr. (D. Mich.) in a letter last week. The letter came in reply to an inquiry made by Diggs on August 26, 1957, the day after Essin a student at Southwestern College, Terrell, Texas, was allegedly struck with a blackjack by a Henderson, Texas, policeman and later fined \$25 because he failed to heed the order of a Continental Trailways bus driver to move to the rear of the bus.

Immediately after the report reached Washington, Diggs wrote the Justice Department requesting an investigation. The Justice Department's reply, dated March 27, 1958, and released by Diggs, Tuesday, pointed out that the Attorney General personally conferred with officials of the Continental Trailways Bus Company in Dallas and hoped the conference would avoid further incidents of this nature.

He claimed that bus company officials denied that there are any segregation signs on the buses of the Continental Trailways Co. And the drivers have been instructed to refrain from either telling passengers or suggesting to them where they should sit.

An innovation — brass choir accompaniment — will be introduced on the Knoxville choral program scheduled for May 18. Russell W. Smith is vocal director; Hugh Magliocco, brass choir director of Knoxville College, Knoxville, Tenn.

The Livingstone College Choir, under the baton of Mrs. Myra M. Thomas, will be broadcast May 25. Livingstone College is in Salisbury, N. C.

Soror Nora E. Lockhart is Regional Director.

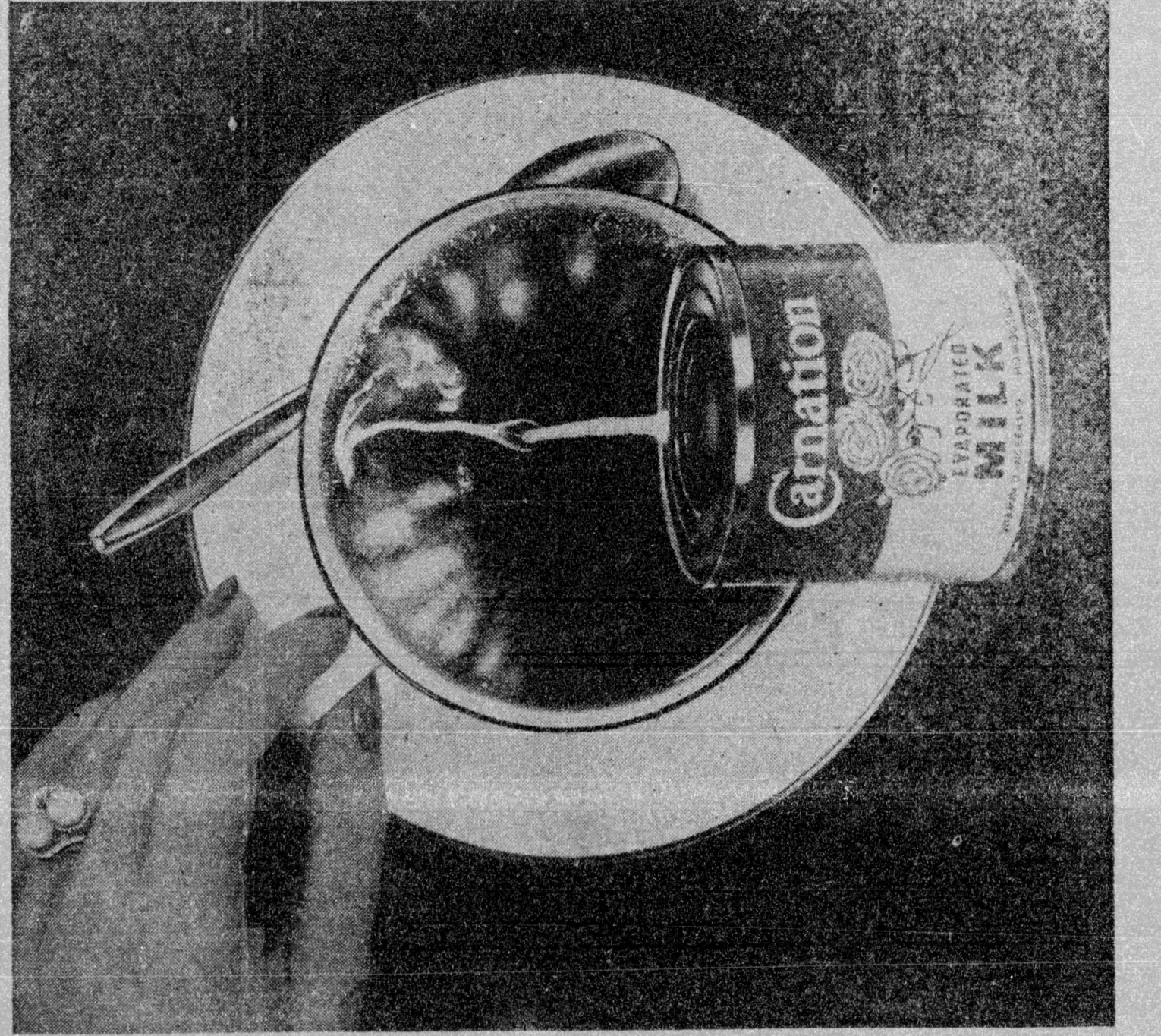
