

# New Dean Of Women At A And T Has Travelled Extensively

GREENSBORO—The new dean of women at A&T College brings to the position a wealth of experience through both travel and training.

Miss Geneva J. Holmes, Greensboro native, who assumed the post in September of this year has not only received special training in her field at some of the leading universities of the world, but has traveled extensively in both Europe, Africa and the Caribbean.

She counts among her most cherished experiences the four and 1-2 years overseas assignment with the American National Red Cross. As director of service clubs in Europe during World War II, Miss Holmes worked in the program from late 1942 to the closing of the European clubs in June of 1947. During this period her travels carried her to England, Scotland, France, Czechoslovakia, Italy and the Middle East.

Her travels in Africa resulted from a one year teaching stint in Sierra Leone. She taught in the

Freestown Secondary School in that country on an international teacher exchange program under a Fulbright Fellowship. While on the continent she traveled in Liberia and Nigeria. Her travels in the Caribbean included visits to Cuba, Haiti, Puerto Rico and British West Indies.

A graduate of Howard University in Washington, D. C., Miss Holmes received the M.A. degree in Guidance and Personnel at Columbia University. She has done other post graduate work at New

York University and at Oxford University in England.

Prior to coming to A&T she had served as director of residence at Bennett College here, counselor to women at Florida A&M University at Tallahassee and dean of women at Fayetteville State Teachers College at Fayetteville.

She holds membership in a host of professional and social organizations and is a member of the Executive Board of the Southern College Personnel Association.

The bids, subject to approval of the Department of Administration of North Carolina at Raleigh, were okayed by the Executive and Building Committees of the trustee board.

## Delta Sorority Gives \$7,182 In Scholarship

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, a public organization of 20,000 college women, announced recently that it has awarded a total of \$7,182 in training grants and scholarships for the current school year.

The Sorority gave \$1,000 to the Referral and Supplementary Scholarship program of the National Scholarship Service and Fund for Negro Students, an organization which selects and subsidizes students for training at interracial colleges.

The Delhi School of Social Work in Delhi, India received by the National YWCA of India with the cooperation of the American YWCA, is now a graduate school of the University of Delhi. It is one of two in all southeastern Asia and the only one which offers a master's degree in social work.

A total of \$3,000 was awarded to five graduate students, one of whom received \$1,000 and four of whom received \$500 each. A total of \$2,082 in varying amounts was awarded to nine undergraduates.

Of the \$3,000 awarded for post graduate study, \$1,000 went to Juanita O. D. Tate of Greensboro who is working towards a Ph. D. in economics at New York University.

The four \$500 awards went to Miss Ethel M. Anderson of Birmingham who is studying speech therapy at the University of California; Mrs. Hilda O. Farlane of New York City who is working towards a masters degree at New York University's Human Relations Center; Miss Mary J. Burek of Chicago who is working towards a masters degree in the Teacher Education Center of the University of Chicago and Mrs. Almedia E. Gould of Institute, W. Va. who is studying at Atlanta University's School of Library Science.

Receiving the undergraduate scholarships were Yvonneeris Smith of Newport News, Va., a medical student at the Medical College of Virginia; Shirley Alexander of Evanston, Illinois, an education major at the University of Illinois; Ethel Mae Ingram of Louisville, an education major at the University of Louisville; Sandra J.

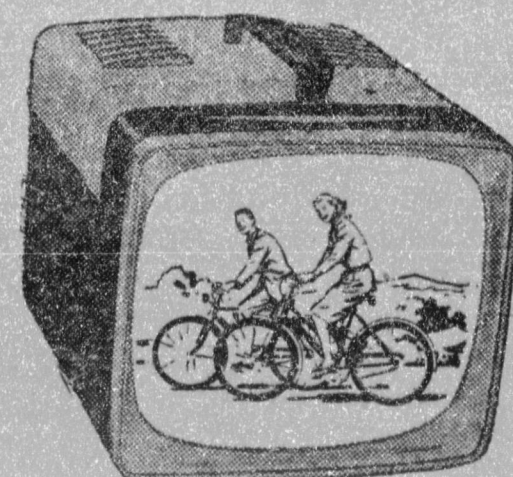
