**N. C.'s Growth Cited At Shaw U. By Governor**

"North Carolina has made more progress in this century than any other State in the Union," Governor Terry Sanford told the Shaw University students and faculty, Dec. 2.

"We started from nothing. In fact we had less than nothing. From where we started, our progress has indeed been remarkable. We were being strangled by poverty; the finest young men and leaders had been killed or crippled; we were suffering corrupt government by the party of so-called Reconstruction; we were sunk in despair, debt, dependency, and oppressed by a vindictive national administration.

Governor Sanford further stated that North Carolina hasn't come far enough and there is much to do. "Working together," he said "may be the most important key. There hasn't been much playing class against class, race against race, section against section, city against town and country, labor against management, group against group — we can't have any of this now."

Governor Sanford asked the people of North Carolina to take the time to understand, to have the courage to hold what we have, to have the vision and faith to move forward in new boldness.

Governor Sanford cited Dr. John R. Larkins as one of the many leaders produced by Shaw University. Also he mentioned such college presidents as Dr. James E. Shepherd, S. G. Atkin, and E. E. Smith who were graduates of Shaw University

**St. Augustine's Receives Grants Totaling \$47,475**

Saint Augustine's College received grants last week amounting to \$47,475. The grants are from the National Science Foundation, the American Church Institute, and an anonymous donor.

The funds have been allotted for the following program: The National Science Foundation grant of \$38,475 will be used to conduct a 1963 Summer Institute in Mathematics, \$7,000 from the anonymous supporter is designated for establishing a Reading Laboratory at the College and the American Church Institute's gift of \$2,000 is to support the high school scholars program.

The Summer Institute in Mathematics is for broadening the subject-matter knowledge of participating high school teachers; acquainting them with new facts, concepts and principles of mathematics; familiarizing the participants with the subject-matter content of the more recent mathematics programs in the high schools; and enhancing their understanding and appreciation of these programs.

**Bailey, Hampton To Appear On TV 'Dimes' Benefit**

Pearl Bailey and Lionel Hampton will appear in the March of Dimes full-hour entertainment special to be held in January 1964. The two artists will contribute their time and talent free in the foundation's play "Once Upon A Dime."

The play is about a group of hoodlums who plan to swap a plastic copy of a million dollar necklace on display as an extra added attraction at a gala March of Dimes benefit show. The hoodlums view the show through a hole they knock in a brick wall between a bank and the stage where the show is. They enjoy the show which has 19 entertainers including Miss Bailey and Hampton.

Lionel appears with his show stopping "Hamp's Twist" and "Air Mail Special" which "really sends 'em" and Miss Bailey brings the house down with "Ma, He's Making Eyes At Me."

Through humorous trickery, the hoodlums steal the necklace and are ready to leave the scene. One hoodlum repairing the hole in the wall when he hears one of the performers tell the truth about "hypogammaglobulinemia," which is the problem of two of the little girls in the program — "not enough gamma globulin, the stuff that prevents infection," and how through the March of Dimes the twins are kept healthy by monthly injections of the necessary medication.

The hoodlum calls his buddy to hear, and they decide to put the necklace back.
