Freedom" is extending its work ino the Delta Area of Mississippi, where it is assisting persons harass-ed for registering to vote. The board of Operation Freedom

oted to expand into Mississippi after receiving reports of wide-spread and bitter hardship result-ing from the drive to register Ne-groes to vote in that state.

The Rev. Clarence T. R. Nelson, Detroit, board chairman, reported that thousands of persons have been cut off from surplus food. Others have been driven off the land, denied credit, shot at, and arrested on trumped-up charges, he said.
For two years Operation Freedom
has been assisting farmers and others subjected to similar harassment

for registering to vote in Fayette and Haywood counties in West Tennessee. Cash grants and loans Tennessee. Cash grants and loans helped to save many families from being driven off the land.

The Delta region of Mississippi adjoins one of the Tennessee counties. It includes some of the richest farming land in the world, producing fine cotton in great quantities.

The area includes 18 counties in which Negroes constitute up to 38


