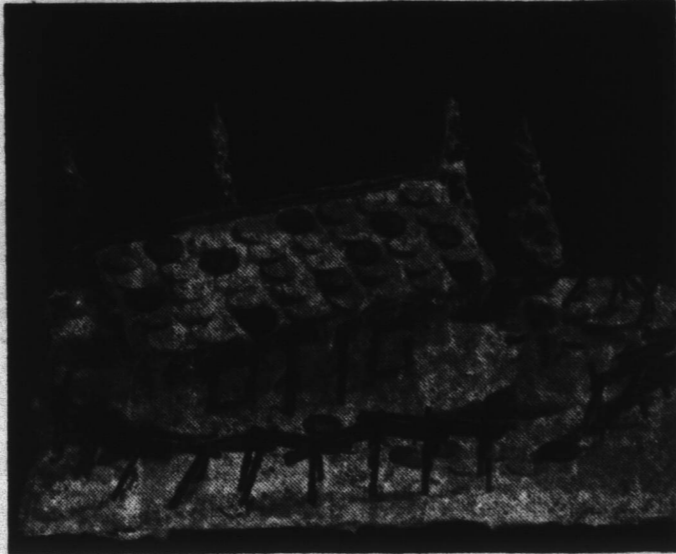

CARNATION COOKING HINTS

CHRISTMAS CANDY HOUSE

- 1 9x2 1/2-inch loaf cake
- 4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar
- 1/4 cup (small can) undiluted CARNATION EVAPORATED MILK
- 3 1/2 to 4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar
- 1/2 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon peppermint extract
- 1/2 cup shortening (not butter)
- 3 packages (1 1/2 ounces each) assorted candy wafers
- Prezels sticks

Mix 4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar with Carnation until smooth. Add remaining 3/4 to 4 cups sifted confectioners' sugar and salt to blended mixture. Beat at medium speed until smooth (about 1 minute). Add peppermint extract and shortening. Beat at high speed until fluffy (about 2 to 3 minutes). Place cake on cookie sheet or tray. Frost cake and tray to resemble snow. Fold a 7x10 1/2 inch piece of cardboard in half lengthwise for roof. Frost. Roof is supported with toothpicks down the center of cake. Decorate roof and make walk with candy wafers. Make door, windows and rail lines with prezels sticks. If desired, make trees by frosting ice cream cones or paper cups. Snowman is made from marshmallows, cloves and prezels. To serve, remove roof and cut cake crosswise.

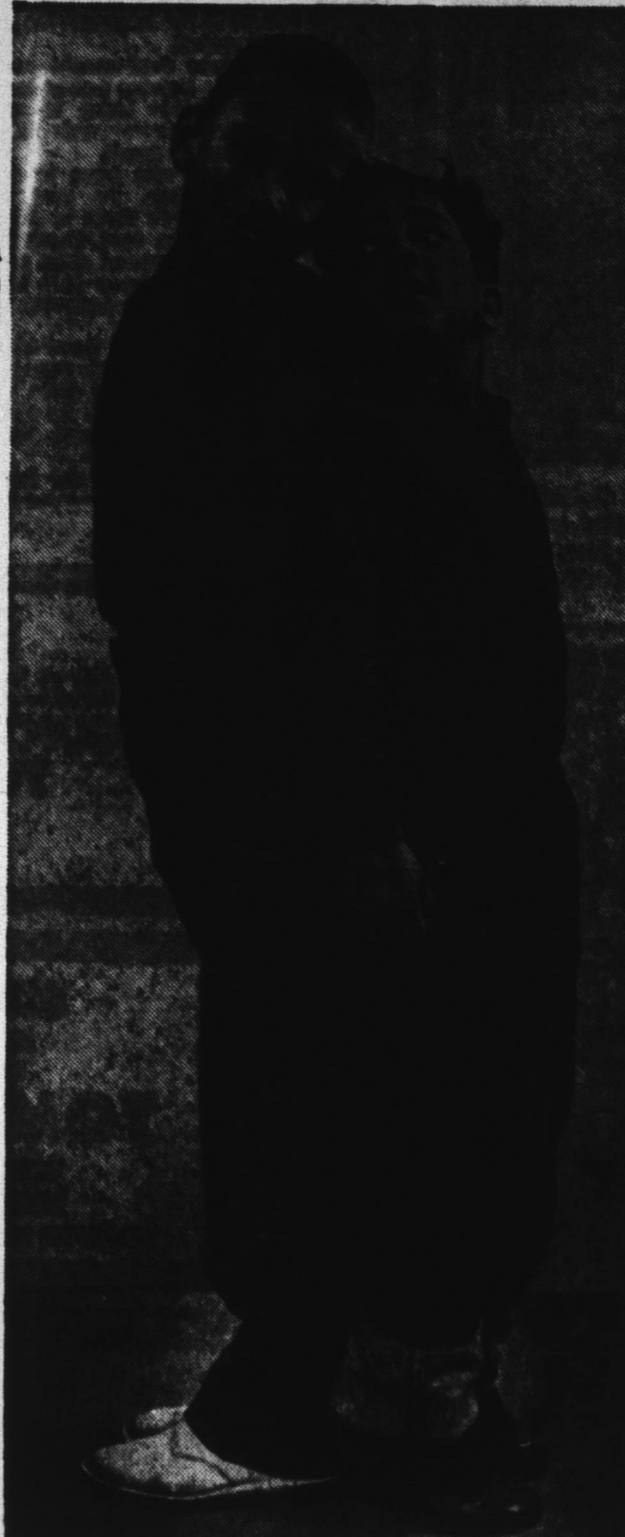
Urban League Gets JFK 'Housing Pen'
