E. J. Hayes Tigers Bow To East End Devils, 56-60

WILLIAMSTON — A sell-out crowd at the jammed packed Hayes gymnasium watched the East End Blue Devils, the Tigers' number one rival, win a heartbreaker by four points in the final seconds of a finger-nail biting game Friday night, Feb. 18.

As the whistle blew and the ball was tossed, there was little or no doubt that coach Herman Boone would have to use all available strategy if he wanted to pull this one out of the first and split with the Blue Devils who had previously defeated his Tigers on their home court.

The Tigers broke into a seven point lead early in the first quarter only to see it dwindle as the Blue Devils began to hit from the outside. It was a very brilliantly played game, and both teams showed signs of being coached by fine coaches. Until the final seconds, it was anybody's game. High scorers for Hayes were Frankie Brown with 12, R. Armstrong, 10 and William Bell 14. For East End, J. Briley 18, and Moore 12.

All-Negro Team In ABC Tournery

The first all-Negro team ever to enter the Classic Division of the American Bowling Congress Tournament is being sponsored by Don Scott, a member of the AMF Staff of Champions.

Scott will serve as captain of the five-man team from Cleveland, Ohio, which includes a member who was taught to bowl by Scott only three years ago. All members of the squad, which has a 200 average, bowl in the All-Star Singles and Doubles Classic leagues in Cleveland.

The team is composed of Larry Polk, 29, who was Scott's pupil 3 years ago and who now maintains a 196 average; Howard Sweeney, 23, with a 194 average; Reginald Douglas, 33, with a 198 average; Brady Walker, 33, with a 210 average; and Scott, who maintains a 206 average.

Scott has been bowling for the past 20 years. He is one of three Negro members of the famed AMF
